## INTRO

**Parents say to your kid(s)** - This is our last week learning about our story of Jesus returning to heaven! That means that this week we will have a special celebration!

**What Do You Remember?** - Part of our lesson today involves a craft, so for this section, take a few minutes to have kids retell the story to you.



# LESSON - GOODBYE - FOR NOW


One of the most important ways we get to disciple kids is by teaching God's Word and how it points to Jesus. Our preschoolers are going through the God Loves Me Storybooks. These books tell the story of Scripture over 12 books, one for each month of the year. For one month kids hear and interact with the same story so that they can learn it well! Each week there is a different activity for the story.

#### **Have Kids Teach the Story -** Goodbye - For Now

**Even When I Can't See Him -** Supplies: paper, markers or colored pencils pushpin, pencil with an eraser

- 1. On the paper, draw straight lines to connect both sets of opposite corners. Then draw a circle in the center that is about 1 inch in diameter.
- 2. Let your child color the pinwheel and the blank back of the sheet.
- Cut out the pinwheel. Then cut along the diagonal lines you drew stopping at the circle.
- 4. Use the pushpin to poke holes in the center of the pinwheel and in the four corners. Twist the pin to make the holes smooth. This will help your pinwheel spin.
- 5. Stick the pushpin through each of the corner holes, through the center hole, then into the top of the pencil eraser. (See drawing.)
- 6. Let your child blow the pinwheel. Watch it spin!

**Say** - Jesus promised to be with us always, even when we can't see Him. It can be hard to remember that something is with us if we can't see it. But even when we can't see the wind, we can see it move our pinwheel! It's there even though we can't see it!









### **RFSPONSF**

**Parents say to your kid(s)** - It's good to respond to learning about Jesus in the Bible. Sometimes we sing because Jesus is worthy of our songs. Sometimes we pray because we need help and God says we can talk to Him about anything! We can also do another activity that relates to our lesson!

**Coloring Sheet -** <u>Printable Coloring Sheet</u> of Jesus going back to heaven.

**Parent Share -** What does it feel like for Jesus to be with you even though you can't see Him?



## **BONUS ACTIVITIES**

**Hopscotch** - The classic game! Use tape inside or chalk outside to create a path of alternating single and double squares. Toss a small beanbag or pebble onto the row of squares. Hop using one foot on the single squares and two feet on the double squares to pick up what you threw. Hop back and let the next person take a turn.

**The Sleeping Song** - Kids will pretend to be asleep as you sing, "Sleeping, Sleeping, all the children are sleeping. And when they woke up, they were all \_\_\_\_\_!" Fill in the blank with various animals or objects and let their imagination run wild. When you say what they will pretend to be, kids jump up and do their best job being that animal or object. Once they pretend, start quietly singing the song again until they pretend to be sleeping again, and fill in the blank with a new animal or object.
