SCRIPTURE: Acts 12:1-19

LESSON: A Prayer for Peter



INTRO

Parents say to your kid(s) - Last week we had a special celebration and did a fun craft about our story *Goodbye – For Now*. Today we are starting a new story about one of Jesus' friends!

Picture Prayer List - Kids love to learn in concrete ways. This activity is a simple object lesson to help your kids interact with the Bible story they're about to learn. *Supplies: paper, glue, pictures of people and things for kids to pray for and to thank God for*

Help kids put together a picture prayer list. Use images of things and people kids can pray for and thank God for. This week, pray together for the things on the list and then encourage your kids to continue praying for those people everyday.



LESSON - A PRAYER FOR PETER

One of the most important ways we get to disciple kids is by teaching God's Word and how it points to Jesus. Our preschoolers are going through the *God Loves Me Storybooks*. These books tell the story of Scripture over 12 books, one for each month of the year. For one month kids hear and interact with the same story so that they can learn it well! Each week there is a different activity for the story.

Read the Story - [A Prayer for Peter](#)

Questions - Use these questions to review the story after you read.

- Why did Peter get in trouble? *He was telling people about Jesus.*
- What did Peter's friend do? *They prayed for Him*
- Who came to rescue Peter from prison? *An angel!*

Say - God listens when we pray to Him! He wants us to talk to Him about the things and people who are important to us!



RESPONSE

Parents say to your kid(s) - It's good to respond to learning about Jesus in the Bible. Sometimes we sing because Jesus is worthy of our songs. Sometimes we pray because we need help and God says we can talk to Him about anything! We can also do another activity that relates to our lesson!

BONUS ACTIVITIES

Simon Says Drawing - A fun variation on Simon Says is to play it with a drawing component. For example: "Simon Says draw a circle. Simon Says draw a stick figure. Draw a squiggly line. Oh no, if you started to draw a squiggly line, you're out."

Bubble Art - *Supplies: bubble solution (or make your own like [this](#)), A bubble wand, food coloring, plastic cups, paper*

This activity can get a little messy, so it is a great one to do outside! You will need a plastic cup for each color that you want to make. Pour a quarter cup or more of the bubble solution into the plastic cups. Mix in about 5 drops of the desired food coloring, repeat this for each color. Stir the food coloring into the bubble solution carefully. Then take the bubble wand and dip it into the cups, blow bubbles onto your paper to create beautiful artwork!
