One Big Thing:

Jesus wants us to share His love everywhere we go.

Review:

This week at Kidtown, we learned that Jesus wants us to be shot out like arrows to show the world His love. Jesus loves all of the people around us no matter where we live. We can share the love of Jesus with others even now while we live with our parents. When we are grown up, we must choose where we will live. We may live in the same city or move to another state or country. No matter where we live, we want to share the good news of the gospel so that others can know God too. *“Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one’s youth. Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them!”* (Psalm 127:4-5)

Good Questions to Ask:

1. **Q:** What is an arrow and a quiver?

A: Arrows were used by warriors long ago. Warriors would use bows to shoot out their arrows short or long distances. They kept their arrows in pouches called quivers.

2. **Q:** Why does the Bible say sons and daughters are like arrows?

A: God's desire is that kids grow up loving Jesus and wanting to share the good news of what He has done for us with everyone they know. Kids can grow up to be like arrows shot out into communities all over the world to share the good news of the gospel.

3. **Q:** How does Jesus help us become like arrows?

A: When we learn about Jesus and trust Him to be our hero, we start to become like an arrows. As we grow up, Jesus will teach us more and more about Himself through our parents and our church family. When we are grownups, Jesus will help us know where we should live and how to share His love with the people we live near.

Pray together as a family:

"Father, Thank you for sending Jesus to rescue us and be our hero. Help us to trust you with our future and believe you have a plan for our lives. Help us to love you and share your love with people wherever we are. Amen."
